We are learning about the outdoors and we went on an adventure to the Edible Garden.

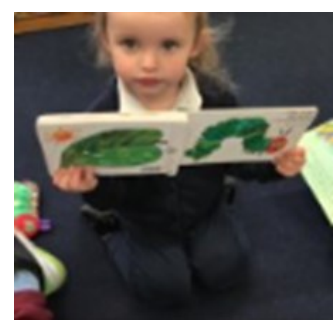
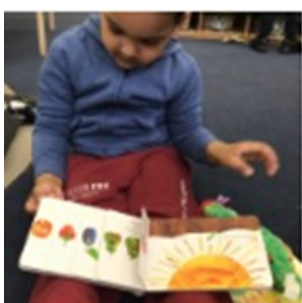


There we found leaves, flowers and bark.
