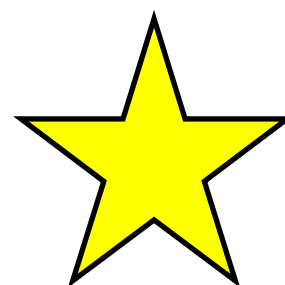

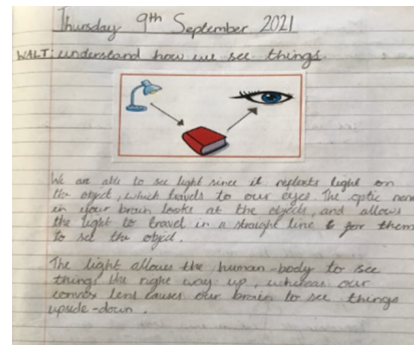
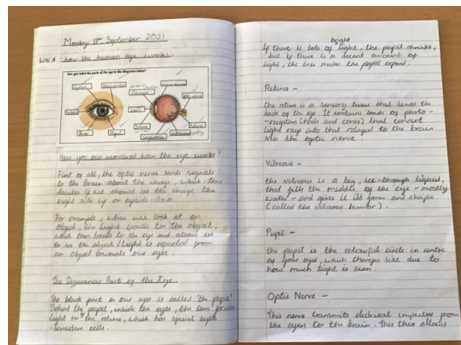

Key Stage Two

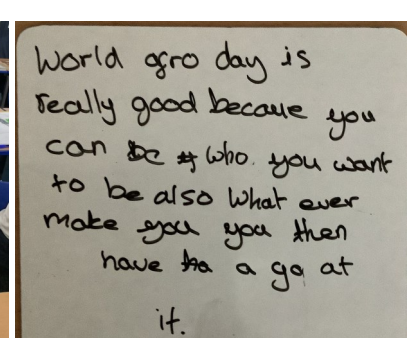
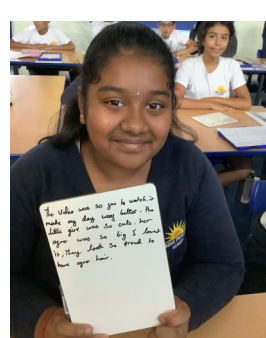
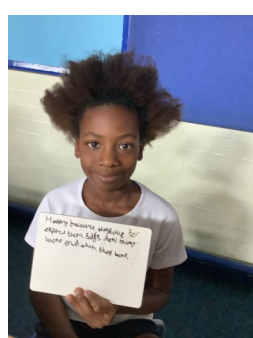
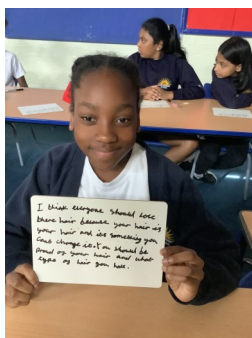


Sunflower class have been learning all about light in Science lessons. They discovered how it allows us to see. The children learnt about different light sources (natural and man-made) and how light is reflected by objects to allow them to be seen by the human eye.

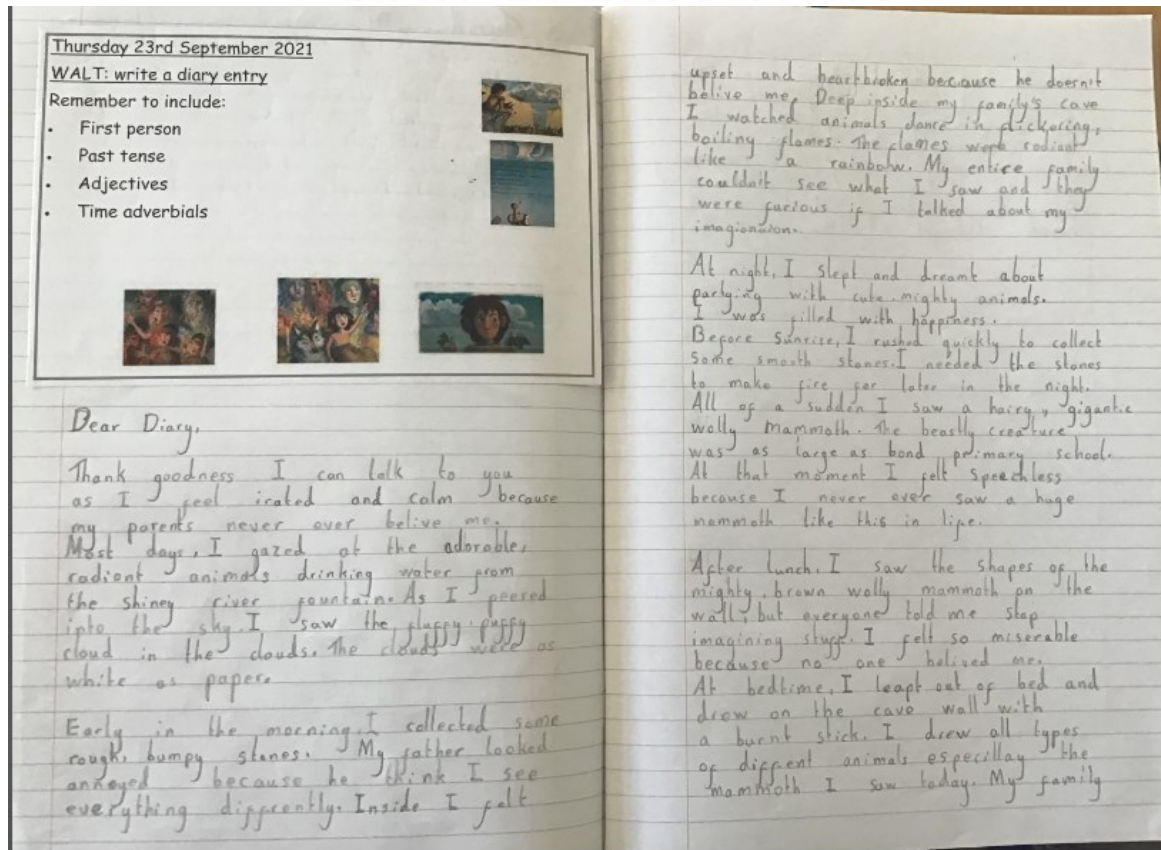

World Afro Day

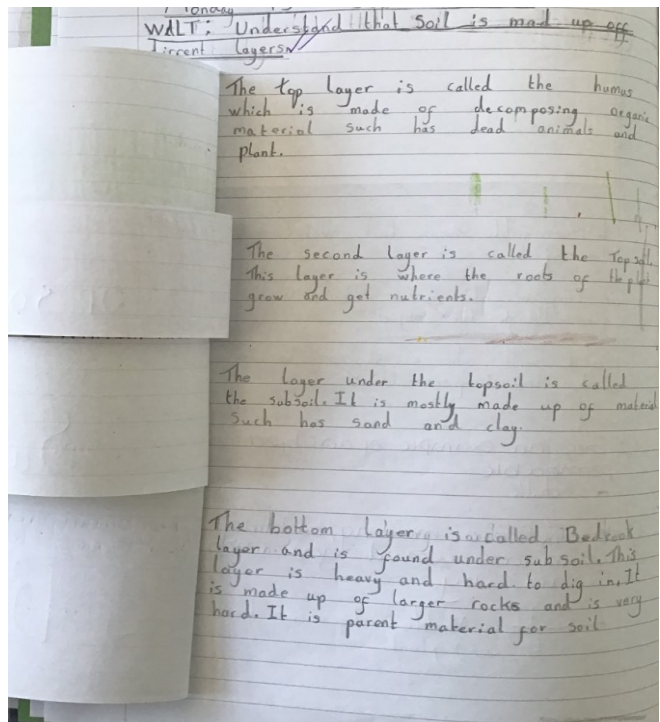
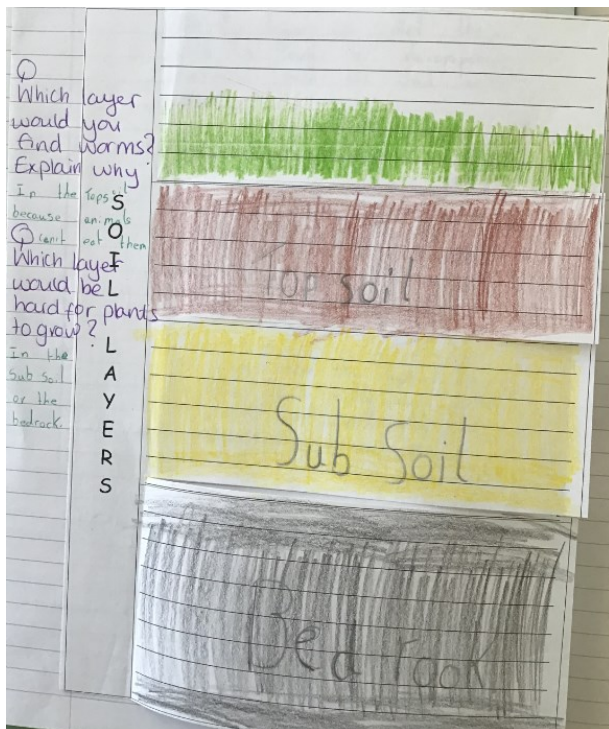
