Headteacher message

Welcome back to you all. The cold weather is a shock to the system—it is very chilly. Please ensure that your children are wrapped up warm as they will still be accessing outdoor play. At the beginning of the day, we have been encouraging the children to wash their hands using the handwashing stations we have outside. However, as a result of the colder temperatures, the water is incredibly cold. Staff are aware of this and will ensure that children use handwashing facilities in the school before entering their classrooms.

As part of our intensive recovery curriculum provision, we have undertaken a round of assessments to identify children's gaps in learning, class timetables are now more `formal' with additional sessions included to support our efforts to catch up on missed learning. Children's homework will be closely aligned to their identified gaps and learning taking place in classrooms. Class teachers have identified where additional support or a different approach is needed to close learning gaps for specific children. Google classroom platform will be used to send home learning. If you experience any difficulties accessing this online platform, please let us know.

Supporting homework

- Establish a quiet time and space for your child to complete their homework
- Encourage your child to explain their learning to you (children will always be set learning that they have been able to complete in class) - tell them to teach you!
- * Ensure that they are doing their own work—this is an opportunity for the children to practise a particular skill.
- Praise your children for their efforts—children respond well to encouragement and praise .
- If you child is finding their home learning difficult, please stop them. Divert their attention to something that they can do well. Use Class Dojo to inform your child's class teacher so that support can be given.
