Children should come to school in their PE kits on their PE days. PE kit: Dark blue/black jogging bottoms/shorts, white polo shirt, trainers, and school jumper. Children must not wear jewellery on their PE days (small studs can be worn), water bottles must be named.

Main symptom of Coronavirus


The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

If a child presents with any of the above at school, you will be asked to collect your child and seek medical advice as soon as possible and follow their advice which may indicate that your child should be tested for Covid 19. Your child must not return to school until you have sought medical advice or a test and have spoken to the school. Please ensure that you keep the school updated on your child's symptoms and advice given.
