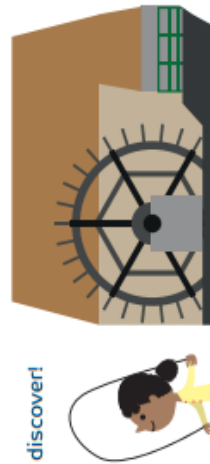


How to play

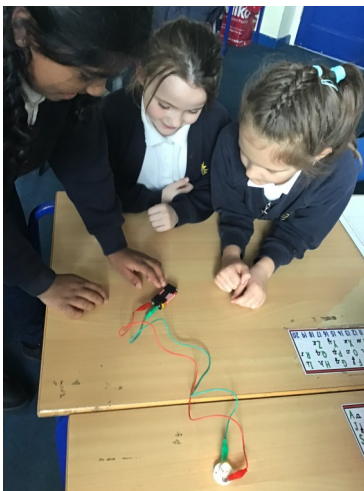

Year 3

Hibiscus class were learning what it takes to make bread. They learnt what ingredients are in bread and how wheat gets from the field into the shops.



In D and T, year three are learning about electrical circuits. We learnt how to make a simple series circuit and a parallel circuit.



Year three published their fables this week by reading them to year two and discussing the morals of their tales.



Year 5

This week Carnation class have been busy learning about Emergency Aid in PSHE. We got into partners and practised the recovery position procedure. During the session, we reflected on how it felt to support someone who needed our help and the importance of being able to keep a level-head when faced with an emergency situation. Everyone felt confident in knowing who to call in an emergency but it also boosted our awareness of how we can support others before the emergency services arrive.



In Computing, we have been busy exploring databases. We compared paper records to those on the computer before taking a vote as to which one was more efficient. The majority of the class concluded that computer databases enabled records to be organised and filtered much quicker than doing it by hand. Databases are a wonderful way of grouping information about countries, animals, food and more. Next, we will be thinking about our own topic interests (superheroes, robotics, cakes, beaches) and creating our own databases.

In celebration of British Science week- we have continued our investigation of the life cycle of different mammals. We then played a game of 'Zoom in' 'Zoom out' on through 'Explorify' where we had to guess what the microscope was showing us.
