### Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

They are presented with 40 words which the children decode (read)—real words and what is known as pseudo- words (not real words). The children are made aware of real words and pseudo- words during the test. Our children are very familiar with this format. Please ensure that your child attends school everyday next week so that they are able to take the test.

Year 4s have been testing their rapid recall of multiplication facts this week. There have been smiles all round with children rising to the challenge. Results will be made available later in the term.
