### Death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II



The news of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has touched many. This morning many of our children arrived to school expressing their sadness. We are now in a period of national mourning that will continue until the end of the State Funeral. In this time of national grief, it is important to acknowledge her legacy and place in UK history as the longest reigning British monarch. It was only a few months ago that the nation joined in celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Classes have held discussions about the Queen's life and death today ensuring that the topic of death is dealt with sensitively in an age appropriate manner. For some children, as well as adults, her death may bring to the fore memories of those nearest and dearest to us who have passed, triggering raw emotions. # Health Updates

## Reception– year 6 Nasal Flu Vaccination

Please check your child's class dojo for a letter regarding nasal flu vaccination. The letter contains a link for you to access the e-consent form. This must be completed for your child to receive the vaccination. Please note the following:

1. Immunisation date 13th October
2. Select the correct full school name (there are multiple schools with similar names)
3. Only ONE parent needs to complete the consent form per child to avoid duplication
4. The portal closing date is **FINAL** – parents will need to contact the Immunisation Team directly after the closing date.

### 1 VACCINES

## Polio vaccine booster campaign in London

In August, the NHS launched an urgent polio vaccine booster campaign for 1-9 year olds in response to detection of poliovirus in sewage. The NHS will contact children when it is their turn to have the vaccine. Children aged 1-4 years will be vaccinated at their GP surgery and those aged 5-9 years will be vaccinated at the mass vaccination sites. Polio vaccine will be offered to those children who are unvaccinated (no/incomplete polio vaccination) and a booster will be offered to those who are fully vaccinated.

The risk to the population of developing symptomatic polio is assessed to be low, due to high vaccine coverage overall, and currently there have been no notified cases of polio in the UK. However, in some areas/communities with lower vaccine coverage, unvaccinated individuals may be at risk. The indicative timeline is to offer the polio vaccine to all 1 to 9 year olds in London by 26<sup>th</sup> September.

# Attendance and Punctuality

Your child's attendance is important. Children who have poor attendance to school have lower academic outcomes due to having gaps in their learning. Children should be in school everyday unless they are too unwell to come to school or there are very significant extenuating circumstances. Family holidays should not be taken during term time—we monitor this carefully looking for year on year patterns. Requests for holidays are not likely to be granted and if taken may result in a penalty fine being issued to one/both parents for each child. Children who arrive very late after close of register will be marked using a 'u' code and this will be included in absence figures.

Our school target is 96% and we must all work hard together to achieve this for each of our children. If you are experiencing any difficulties in achieving this, please speak with Miss Waysay as soon as possible.

# After school clubs

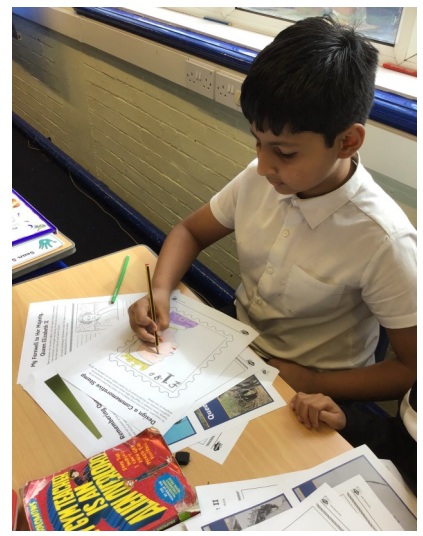
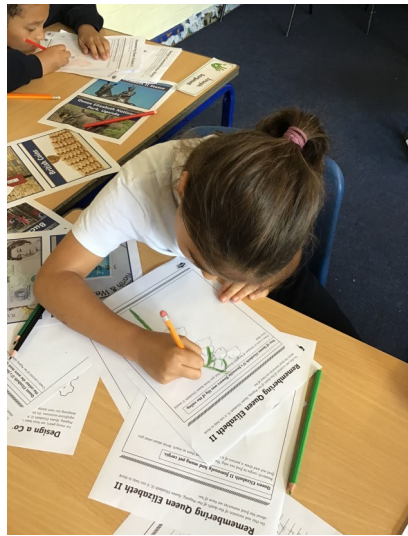

Information regarding our afterschool enrichment clubs will be sent next week with a view to starting the week beginning 19th September.

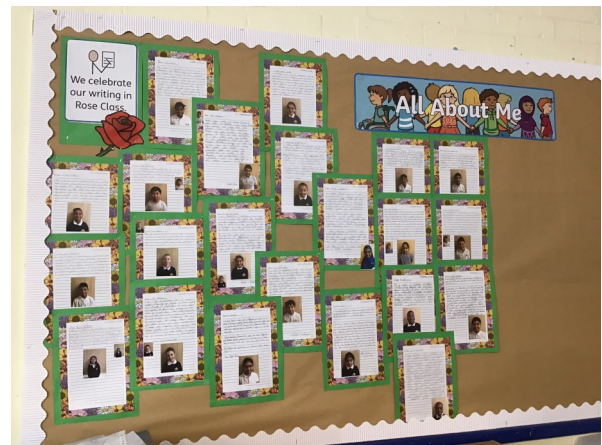


# Year 5
